Well, 2014 has come and gone and we welcome 2015 with high hopes and big dreams for a good year even though the economy unfortunately seems to be on a downward spiral. We therefore rely on kind hearts to keep us going with our work in the Squatter Camps, Informal Settlements and Townships.

There are far too many puppies being born in the Townships and there are still thousands of Township Tails that need to be sterilised. To see first hand what our fieldworkers experience on a daily basis when undertaking Outreaches will surely make your wallet open a weeny bit wider so that we can stamp out the indiscriminate breeding (sterilise, sterilise, sterilise), the suffering, the starvation and the cruelty.

Puppies and kittens are abused by adults and children alike. Most of them have total disregard for God's furry creatures which is very sad and it is for this reason that Operation Touch was initiated.

These children are the future and if we can instil proper animal care in their minds from an early age (the earlier the better) then perhaps one day all animals will be treated kindly and with respect.

Operation Touch is held twice a month at the Shelter. Children are transported from the Townships to the Shelter and are given a lesson on the correct way to treat and care for animals. They are given snacks and cool drinks after the lesson and then interact with the cats and dogs. They take home with them a little booklet on basic animal care, which we compiled specially for the children, a bookmark with Bible verses and a "I love all animals" sticker. We make it a fun day for them so they will not be bored and hopefully they will tell all their little friends about the great day they spent at the Shelter.

We are looking for some kind heart to sponsor our stationery, refreshment and transport costs which all add up and put a strain on our purse strings. We usually cater for between 60 and 100 children per month.

We are hoping that at the end of the day we will have lots of kind hearts to thank for their generosity. Remember, we are in a position to furnish Income Tax Certificates in terms of Section 18A of the Income Tax Act if required.

1104 Dogs, 433 Puppies, 75 Cats and 14 Kittens for fleas, ticks, worms, mange and minor ailments, making a grand total of 1,626 animals.

Shadow is approximately 9 months old, well socialised, and cat friendly. She also gets on with pigs, goats and horses.




