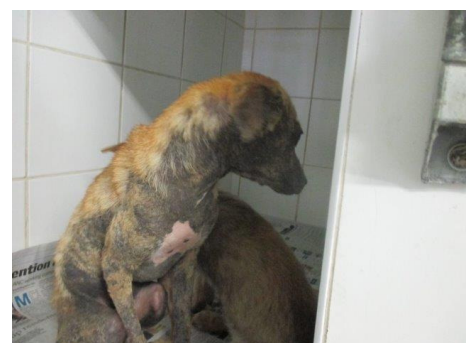
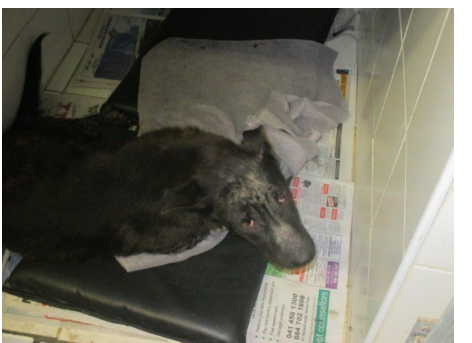

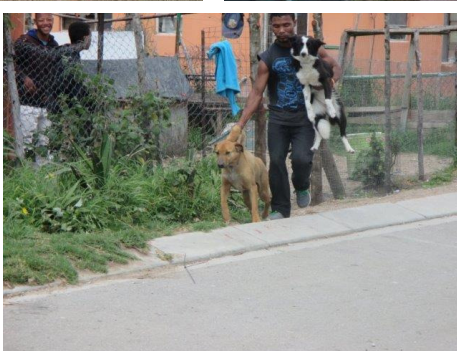


TOWNSHIP TAILS

In September & October 2015 we undertook Outreaches in Enon, Valencia, Bergsig, Beersheba, Mission Road, Aquapark and Nsengeni

We treated:

1,079 Dogs, 276 Puppies, 37 Cats and 8 Kittens for fleas, ticks, worms, mange and minor ailments, making a grand total of 1,400 animals.

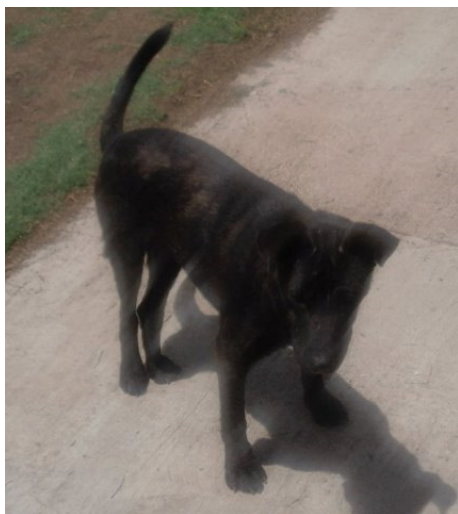

WOMBLE

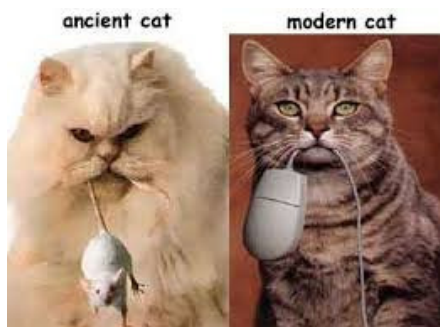

We were requested by the neighbours of the owner of Bella to have two dogs sterilised. When we went to investigate we found Bella cowering in a dilapidated kennel in flooded surrounds. We could not find her mate. Taking into consideration her shocking condition we assumed that her mate had died. We brought her back to the Shelter where she is being treated for severe mange and worms. Bella is about two years old and certainly had a hard life before being rescued. She does not trust people but is close to Louise who is taking care of her. In spite of her ordeal she is making good progress and is happy to run with the rest of the hounds.
